  - a. Yes, it is the current adult menu.

  - a. Attached.
3. Does the 3000 calorie requirement for Juveniles include the snack calories or are the snack calories to be in addition to the regular menu at 3000 calories?
  - a. The 3000 calories does not include the snack. The snack is in addition to the caloric count.
4. Are there any special menu provisions provided for Work Release?
  - a. Yes. A bag lunch is offered if a meal(s) are missed.
5. Please provide a copy of the current staff menus with pricing if applicable.
  - a. N/A
6. What is the current procedure for staff meal ordering, billing, payment by staff, meal cost, etc.?
  - a. N/A

  - a. No, we do not.

- a. The ADP is in the RFP, and we have no plans for expansion.

- a. Attached is page 1 of Policy 4401 for current times. But we plan on having discussions with whomever gets the contract because we are looking to change the times for lunch and dinner to an hour later than currently scheduled.
- 13. What are the Staff Meal service times?**
- a. N/A
- 14. What time does the kitchen open and close each day?**
- a. Currently 0600 to 1800 approximately. We are certainly open to more traditional times.
- 15. Please describe the Juvenile feeding procedures (bulk, thermal trays, how delivered or transported, etc.)**
- a. The meals are prepared at CCNO on thermal trays and the Juvenile Facility picks up from, and returns trays, to CCNO.
- 16. How many Holiday / Spirit Lifter meals are being provided now each year and how many will the Agency require under the contract?**
- a. 12 Holiday/Spirit lifters. 1 per month.
- 17. How many sack lunches are required daily? Please provide the current sack lunch menu. Please note any special menu requirements for work details.**
- a. We do bag lunches for inmates going to court and that averages between 15 and 20 M-F. We also do bagged lunches for our work release inmates that average around 5 M-F. There are approximately 550 (Depending on population) breakfast bags for CCNO and another 24-35 for the Juvenile Center made daily for breakfast.
- 18. Is there currently a program in place that provides the ability for inmates to order fresh foods from the kitchen and pay for those foods with their commissary account? If so please provide information on this program for the following:**
- a. Yes.
    - A. Approved menus and prices
      - a. Menu varies based on the contractor. The price based on contracted and approved by the facility.
    - B. Service schedules (when inmates order-when they are delivered)
      - a. Attached is page 4 of Policy 4410.

- C. Who delivers the completed orders?
  - a. The kitchen/commissary vendor staff.
- D. What is the annual sales volume in dollars?
  - a. \$2400 in 2021.
- E. What is the current commission rate?
  - a. See in attached contract.
- F. What was the annual dollar commissions realized over the past year?
  - a. None occurred.
- G. Are there any restrictions or limits for purchases?
  - a. Yes
- H. Does the program allow for family and friends to also order items on the menu via phone or internet? If not is this something the facility would approve of?
  - a. I don't believe they do, but we are open to allowing it.
- I. How many inmates on average are eligible to participate in this program on any given week?
  - a. All inmates are eligible to exclude disciplinary inmates who are only able to receive indigent kits at CCNO.

**19. Regarding Inmate workers:**

- A. How many inmate workers are provided in the operation?
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> shift has an average of 16 inmate workers, and 2<sup>nd</sup> shift has an average of 9 inmate workers.
- B. What are the shift times they work?
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> shift is 0630 to 1230 and 2<sup>nd</sup> shift is 1230 to 1730.
- C. Are they paid and if so by whom and how much?
  - a. The inmates are not paid but we do have the inmate fund we utilize for incentives along with receiving earned credit.
- D. Do they receive double portions and can the contractor bill for double portions?
  - a. It is up to the contractor if they get double portions and we do not charge for double portions.

**20. Are there officers assigned to the kitchen? If so is this always when the kitchen is open and operating?**

- a. No

**21. How many current food service employees are working in the operation? Please provide the current staff positions, work schedules, etc.**

- a. Commissary has 1 staff plus 1 manager. Kitchen has 2 staff plus 1 director that oversees both kitchen and commissary.

**22. Please provide a list of catering events the vendor may be expected to provide during the normal year. Additionally, please provide information regarding any billing/payment for these events.**

- a. There is no billing available and it would be negotiated at that time. Contractors have assisted with staff parties,

Christmas party and picnic, and also an annual volunteer banquet.

23. Are there any restrictions for deliveries of foods and supplies to the dock by your vendors? What are the approved hours for product and supply deliveries to the facility?

- a. There is no loading doc, however the current contract unloads with the pallet jack. We do have a fork lift available if the contractor has certified operators. Monday through Friday 0800-1500, excluding holidays.

24. How many inmates are on special diets and what types of diets are they on? Are there any unusual requirements the vendor needs to be aware of for billing purposes (snacks, nutritional supplements, kosher/Halal diets, etc.)

- a. See attachment. Religion, yes and ordered medical needs.

- a. Styrofoam is used for discipline and segregations as needed.

26. Will the Agency provide the Contractor with phone and internet service, or will these be the responsibility of the Contractor?

- a. Yes, CCNO will provide phone and internet.

27. Is a loading dock and dock leveler available whereby a lift gate for delivery trucks would not be required?

- a. No, lift gates are needed.

- a. \$22.03.

- a. The training is provided at CCNO in a classroom. A sample scheduled is attached.

**a. Yes, the technology will remain in place. It will be made to interact with the vendor technology.**

- a. Once from commissary and twice (1 hygiene and 1 food) from family.**

- a. In house purchasing is \$100 (\$110 for workers) and online is 2 boxes.

**Q: Is it required that provision of services remain on location at CCNO or will CCNO accept bids that allow a vendor to pull commissary and online orders (family and friends) offsite from a vendor's secured warehouse?**

- a. Commissary onsite is not required.

**Q: Can you please provide a copy of the current commissary processing and distribution schedule?**

- a. Yes, page 4 of Policy 4410 is attached.

**Q: Can you advise if the commissary space will be furnished with racking, or will that be the responsibility of the vendor?**

- a. Yes, CCNO furnishes.

**Q: Is there currently any inmate labor associated with the current commissary operation and if so, will that continue with any newly awarded vendor? If so, can you please provide the quantity of inmates allowed to assist with the commissary operation?**

- a. Yes, 3 inmates to fill orders only.

**Q: What type of packaging is used for commissary orders?**

- a. Boxes, they're delivered to the units and the box is returned.

**Q: What is the current method of transportation used within the facility to deliver commissary orders?**

- a. Carts by contractor staff to the units.

**Q: Are there any restrictive hours in which commissary cannot be delivered throughout the week?**

- a. Hours of scheduled deliveries are attached. No deliveries during counts and shift changes.

**Q: Does the facility have a dock for deliveries or will a truck with a liftgate be required?**

- a. There is no dock.

**Q: Can you please provide the hours of operation in which the receiving dock is open?**

- a. There is no dock. Deliveries are Monday through Friday 0800-1500 excluding holidays.



**Policy:**

Each inmate at the Corrections Center of Northwest Ohio (CCNO) is served three (3) meals per day in accordance with the menu for that day and to maintain the health of the inmates. Foods prepared and served in the CCNO will be of the highest quality and greatest variety possible. Meals will be served within budgetary constraints and with all due promptness. All inmates regardless of classification status will be provided a meal. Meals will not be withheld as a punishment. CCNO precludes the use of food as a disciplinary measure. Dining space should be large enough to allow for meals to be served, affording each inmate the opportunity to have at least twenty (20) minutes of dining time for each meal. **(4-ALDF-4A-01)**. The CCNO provides that meals are prepared, delivered, and served under staff supervision **(4-ALDF-4A-17)**. The CCNO requires that at least three (3) meals (including two hot meals) are provided at regular meal times during each 24-hour period, with no more than fourteen (14) hours between the evening meal and breakfast. Variations may be allowed based on weekend and holiday food service demands provided basic nutritional goals are met **(4-ALDF-4A-18) (5120:1-8-10(B))**.

## MANAGEMENT OPERATING AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this, November 5, 2018, by and between the Corrections Commission of Northwest Ohio, a multi-county municipal correctional facility having its place of business at 03151 County Road 2425, Stryker OH 43557-9418, ("CCNO"), and Aramark Correctional Services, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, having its place of business at 2400 Market Street, Philadelphia, PA 19103, ("Aramark").

### WITNESSETH:

1. **GRANT:** CCNO grants to Aramark the exclusive right to provide food service for the inmates (including work release inmates), staff and visitors at the Corrections Center of Northwest Ohio located at 03151 County Road, Stryker, Ohio 43557 ("Corrections Center") and the exclusive right to operate a commissary (excluding vending machine operation) at the Corrections Center for inmates.

CCNO grants to Aramark the non-exclusive right to provide food service for inmates at the juvenile detention facility ("Juvenile Center") located at 03389 County Road 2425, Stryker, Ohio 43557. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, CCNO may revoke the non-exclusive right to provide food service for the inmates at the Juvenile Center upon 14 days written notice to Aramark if CCNO terminates the agreement with the Northwest Ohio Juvenile Detention District. (As used herein, the Corrections Center and the Juvenile Center are collectively referred to as the "Facility" or "Facilities".)

Aramark shall furnish well prepared, nutritionally adequate meals that meet the American Correctional Association, National Sheriffs Association, and American Medical Association, National Commission on Correctional Health Care and Standards for Jails in Ohio (Full Service Facilities) guidelines and standards.

Aramark further agrees as follows:

- (A) Aramark shall provide advice and assistance to CCNO to insure the smooth operations of the Corrections Center.
- (B) Aramark shall provide three meals per day, 365 days per year (366 days during leap years) for the Corrections Center and the Juvenile Center. Food for service at the Juvenile Center shall be prepared for pick-up by Juvenile Center staff not more than thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled meal time.
- (C) Aramark shall prepare menus covering a minimum of 4 weeks, meeting the current applicable National Commission on Correctional Health Care, American Medical Association, American Correctional Association, and Standards for Jails in Ohio (Full-Service Facilities) guidelines and requirements. Such menus shall be changed seasonally (summer, fall, winter, spring) and include portion sizes. Each menu shall include a statement of nutritional adequacy, prepared by a registered dietitian detailing the caloric and nutritional content of the menu. All menus shall include



special holiday meals (New Year's, Easter, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving, and Christmas).

- (D) Each weekly menu shall have an average caloric content of 2,800 calories per day. The Juvenile Center menu shall have a weekly average of 3,000 calories per day plus an evening snack. All portion sizes shall be adequate. All entrée portions are purchased fully cooked, within manufacturer tolerance specifications. Weight measurements are prior to reheating. Casseroles and entrée items made from scratch are based upon cooked weight measurements. Weights on cookies made from mix are prior to baking. Side dishes are volume measurements.
- (E) At the direction of the Corrections Center's physician and/or Director of Operations and/or Director of Security, Aramark shall provide special diets for particular inmates.
- (F) Aramark shall maintain and provide to CCNO a permanent record of the number of meals served, the food content of each meal and any menu substitutions or modifications. Such records shall include the items and portion sizes, the reason for the substitution and verification that a dietitian has been consulted when appropriate.
- (G) Aramark shall provide additional food and/or beverage services upon written request of an authorized representative of CCNO at mutually agreed upon prices for such services. Aramark acknowledges that time is of the essence in providing such additional food and service and in providing food service in emergency situations.
- (H) All food, both hot and cold, shall be served at optimum temperatures. No time span between meals shall exceed 14 hours.
- (I) Reusable beverage cups and spoons provided by CCNO will be utilized for issuing to the inmates. Aramark staff will ensure that cups and spoons are not thrown out or disposed of during the shift. Beverages will be provided by Aramark with each meal. Supplemental beverage offerings will be available for purchase through the commissary.
- (J) Aramark shall provide a variety of wholesome and nutritious brown bag lunches for inmates on the work release program; public works program; and inmates outside the facility for court attendance in accordance with the minimum caloric standards set forth herein. A minimum four (4) week cycle menu for brown bag lunches, changed seasonally (summer, fall, winter, and spring) including portion sizes, shall be provided to CCNO.
- (K) Aramark shall provide documentation for compliance with all applicable standards (American Correctional Association, Standards for Jails in Ohio (Full-Service Facilities)) by the 15th of each month to CCNO. Annual documentation for

standards compliance shall be provided by the 15<sup>th</sup> of January for the previous year. Documentation will be submitted to CCNO's Accreditation and Inspection Supervisor.

In addition to the foregoing, Aramark shall provide:

- (A) an organizational chart for use in the Facility;
- (B) a method of supervision to be used including the corporate staff;
- (C) ongoing pre-service and continuing in-service training programs for management, staff and inmate labor
- (D) an inventory control system
- (E) internal security of products and equipment;
- (F) a program for addressing complaints regarding food services; and
- (G) a regularly updated work schedule for regular employees and inmate labor.

All of the foregoing shall be in accordance with the Request for Proposals - Offender Food Services & Commissary ("RFP"), including the Specifications attached thereto ("Specifications") and the Proposal dated August 28, 2018 delivered in response thereto by Aramark ("Proposal"). The terms of the RFP (including the Specifications) and the Proposal are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein. If there is a conflict between this Agreement and either the RFP (including the Specifications) or the Proposal, then this Agreement shall be controlling over both the RFP (including the Specifications) and the Proposal shall be controlling over the RFP.

## 2. OPERATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- (A) With respect to meals not served in the food serving area, CCNO personnel shall receive meals at the jail kitchen and transport to appropriate areas, and return the trays in a timely manner. With respect to meals transported by CCNO, CCNO shall be responsible for the condition of the meal from the point of delivery of the meal to CCNO, including maintaining such meals at the proper temperature and free of adulteration.
- (B) **FOOD PRODUCTS AND CLEANING SUPPLIES:** Aramark shall purchase, pay, receive, store, prepare, produce, serve and/or package for delivery all food products to meet the prescribed menu. Aramark shall also purchase and pay for all cleaning supplies, dish machine products and paper supplies. All such items purchased by Aramark shall remain the property of Aramark.
- (C) **SANITATION:** Aramark shall be responsible for:

- (1) All cleaning, including floor maintenance and cleaning in the food preparation serving, receiving and storage areas, trash compactor area (only the trash that is created as a result of the food service and commissary business run by Aramark), as well as floors in the kitchen, commissary and delivery hallways. Aramark shall supervise inmate laborers during the painting of all the foregoing areas on a regular basis, but CCNO shall supply all paint. Cleaning and janitorial services shall be performed on a regular schedule and must meet the highest standards of sanitation prescribed by local, state or federal laws or regulations, whichever are most stringent.
  - (2) Establishing and maintaining a rigid sanitation program that complies with all health department or other governmental rules, orders or regulations.
  - (3) Insuring that all Aramark employees practice appropriate hygiene, including, but not limited to, wearing clean uniforms, sanitary hand coverings and hair restraints at all times when they are performing their duties.
  - (4) Arranging regular inspections of the foregoing areas by appropriate health, fire safety and other inspectors and obtaining all required permits and licenses. Copies of all Inspection reports shall be provided to the CCNO Executive Director. Such reports shall be accompanied by a description of the corrective action taken.
- (D) Aramark shall install such computer hardware and related equipment and software (collectively "Computer Equipment"), including but not limited to Aramark's CORE® commissary management information systems (the "CORE® System") as necessary to support Aramark's commissary operations. Aramark shall remove all Computer Equipment upon the expiration or termination of this Agreement. The CORE® System is and shall at all times be owned by Aramark, which shall hold all rights relative thereto except as may be expressly granted hereunder and then only to the extent of such express grant. All use of the CORE® System at the Facility shall immediately cease upon the expiration or termination of this Agreement. Aramark shall be responsible to support and maintain all Computer Equipment during the term of this Agreement, but any and all such obligations shall cease upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement. To the extent that it is necessary for Aramark's or CCNO's employees to be trained to use the CORE® System, Aramark shall provide such training, provided that Aramark shall have no other training obligations hereunder. Aramark will adhere with CCNO Policy and Procedure concerning computer hardware and software use; provided such Policy and Procedure does not interfere with CCNO and Aramark doing business.

CCNO shall furnish building maintenance services for the facility and shall provide preventative maintenance and equipment repairs and replacements for any CCNO owned equipment.

CCNO shall run such cable and wiring, and shall perform such systems integration, as necessary, to enable the CORE® System to support Aramark's commissary operations. In the event CCNO changes any third party vendor whose service interacts with the CORE® System (such as its telephone or internet service provider), any costs associated with CORE® System customization or code changes will be borne by CCNO.

Delivering commissary products to all offenders to include ones who are indigent.

- (E) Follow all established CCNO Policies & Procedures. CCNO Policies & Procedures shall remain confidential unless approved by CCNO to be distributed in accordance with law. Aramark shall not copy or print any policies without prior written consent.

CCNO shall be responsible for:

- (1) Providing janitorial services outside of the food preparation, serving, receiving, storage areas and hallways adjacent to the kitchen, commissary and delivery area.
- (2) Cleaning all vents and duct work leading to the food preparation areas as necessary.
- (3) Providing pest control for food service areas.
- (4) Providing an adequate trash removal facility or service, including the use of recycling and compaction facilities consistent with a high standard of sanitation.
- (5) Providing space for food service and commissary operations. The CCNO shall provide adequate ingress and egress, including a reasonable use of corridors, passageways, driveways, and loading platforms.
- (6) Providing, installing, maintaining, replacing, if necessary and at its own cost, and permitting Aramark to use, all food service equipment in place within the food service areas, unless such maintenance, repair and replacement is caused by the negligence of the Aramark or its regular employees, in which Aramark shall reimburse the CCNO for such costs upon demand.
- (7) Assisting Aramark in maintaining adequate security for all food service areas at all times during the food service operations.
- (8) Providing, at its own expense, all utilities necessary for the operations outlined herein.

- (9) Providing reasonable office facilities for Aramark supervisory employees.
  - (10) Providing accurate and timely meal orders to Aramark, by location and type, to be served to inmates.
  - (11) Authorizing commissary spending limits of at least \$80/week per inmate (unless an emergency situation requires a temporary reduction). For the avoidance of doubt, phone card purchases by inmates shall not count towards their \$80 spending limit.
- (G) PERSONNEL: Aramark shall provide expert administrative, dietetic, purchasing, equipment consulting and personnel advice and supervision. Aramark shall provide CCNO with one (1) full time food service director, one (1) full time assistant manager, one (1) full time commissary supervisor, and two (2) full time cook supervisors. All salaries, wages, taxes, worker's compensation insurance and fringe benefits will be borne by Aramark for its employees. Aramark shall pay for any needed license, permits or insurance costs.

CCNO shall maintain an adequate staff of inmates at the Corrections Center kitchen for each of two (2) eight (8) hour shifts per day for the efficient operation thereof. Such inmates shall be assigned duties in the food service operation that may include sanitation, food preparation and production, and storeroom functions. In addition, CCNO shall maintain an adequate staff of inmates for the commissary operations during such hours and days as CCNO and Aramark mutually agree upon.

Aramark shall cooperate with CCNO in establishing a certified training program for inmate labor.

Aramark shall comply with all requirements and standards of the Prison Rape Elimination Act.

With respect to all Aramark employees, Aramark shall:

- (1) Provide CCNO with the names, current addresses, dates of birth, driver's license number and state issued, social security numbers, home telephone numbers and other information reasonably requested by CCNO in order to conduct a background inquiry, fingerprints and security check.
- (2) Require periodic physical examinations by the CCNO medical staff as specified in state or local regulations, whichever are more stringent.
- (3) Provide both pre-service and continuing in-service training and instruction, including but not limited to, instruction on safety, sanitation, food handling, security and related matters.

- (4) Require all employees to attend and successfully complete the appropriate Pre-Service Training for contract staff and Orientation Training conducted through CCNO at the first available training. Such training shall not exceed two (2) weeks (or 80 hours) per employee unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties in writing. After the initial 80-hour training during staff's first year, Provider staff will attend annual training requirements of at least 40-hours and other topics deemed necessary or required by the CCNO Executive Director.
- (5) Provide employee uniforms.

CCNO reserves the right to approve or disapprove at CCNO's sole discretion any employee of Aramark prior to that employee's assumption of any duties at the Facilities and the right to deny any of Aramark's employees access to a Facility who, at any time, do not meet the established security clearances or established rules and regulations. Final selection of all Aramark employees at the Facility shall be with the approval of the CCNO.

With respect to the food service manager, Aramark shall provide a trained, knowledgeable and experienced food service manager. Prior to assuming the duties of food service manager, Aramark shall provide a resume of the food service manager. CCNO retains the right to interview the food service manager, conduct background and security checks, and to approve the employment of the food service manager.

It is expressly understood that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing an employer/employee relationship between Aramark and such inmate personnel and that nothing contained herein shall be construed as obligating Aramark to comply with any employment laws, rules or regulations with respect to such inmate personnel, including but not limited to, any State or Federal wage or hour laws, safety laws, worker's compensation statutes, etc. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing any employee/employer relationship or any other relationship between the CCNO and any employee or prospective employee of Aramark.

CCNO acknowledges that Aramark has invested considerable amounts of time and money in training its supervisory employees in the system, procedures, methods, forms, reports, formulas, computer programs, recipes, menus, plans, techniques and other valuable information which is proprietary and unique to Aramark's manner of conducting its business. Therefore, CCNO agrees that supervisory employees of Aramark will not be hired by CCNO for the term of this Agreement in any food service preparation capacity. For the purpose of this prohibition, "supervisory employees" shall mean the food service director and commissary manager at any time during the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding termination of this Agreement.

CCNO retains the right to thoroughly investigate any current or prospective employees assigned to the Corrections Center. Aramark shall not, however, be required to have any employee or prospective employee submit to any type of lie detector test, except to the extent permitted by the Employee Polygraph Protection Act of 1988, 29 U.S.C. §2001 et

seq. If Aramark incurs any costs, including, retroactive wages and damages, as a result of any wrongful actions of CCNO, CCNO shall reimburse Aramark for such costs.

- (H) **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY:** Aramark and CCNO shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, sexual preference, national origin, physical or mental handicap, weight, age, or marital status in violation of any local, state or federal law, regulation or rule. Aramark shall take affirmative action to maintain and promote non discrimination in all phases of employment, including the use of facilities.
- (I) **INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION:** Aramark shall furnish insurance as follows:

Worker's Compensation and Employers Liability Statutory amounts: \$100,000.00 each accident.

Aramark must carry liability insurance in the amount of \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence. A copy of the certificate of insurance must be maintained on file at the office of CCNO during the terms of the agreement. CCNO will be included as an additional insured with Aramark to the extent CCNO is liable for loss or damage arising out of Aramark's negligence in its performance of the services defined in this Agreement. Any insurance coverage (additional insured or otherwise) that Aramark provides for CCNO shall only cover insured liability assumed by Aramark in this Agreement; such insurance coverage shall not otherwise cover liability in connection with or arising out of the wrongful or negligent acts or omissions of CCNO. Notice of cancellation of any insurance policies required herein shall be subject to ACORD 25 Certificate of Liability standards, and will be delivered, as applicable, in accordance with policy provisions.

Property insurance for physical damage to the property of Aramark.

Aramark shall cause the insurance companies issuing the aforesaid policies of insurance, or its broker, to forward to CCNO certificates of insurance and renewal certificates. CCNO shall be included as an "additional insured" on all such policies to the extent CCNO is liable for loss or damage arising out of Aramark's negligence in its performance of the services defined in this Agreement. Each such policy shall provide that it shall not be canceled, reduced or modified by the insurer without 30 days prior written notice to CCNO,

Aramark agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the CCNO, its officers, employees, agents and servants for any third party claims for accidents or occurrences involving death, bodily injury and damage to tangible property caused by the negligence or wrongful act of Aramark and arising out of Aramark's performance of the services defined in this Agreement or caused by Aramark's sole negligent failure to properly supervise any Aramark employees or inmates under the supervision or direction of Aramark, and to pay all claims, damages, judgments,

legal costs, adjuster fees and reasonable attorney fees related thereto. However, it is expressly understood that Aramark shall not be responsible for damages, injuries, losses, or claims caused by inmates or the County, its officer, employees, agents, servants or other independent contractors, except to the extent that such damage could have been prevented by appropriate supervision. It is acknowledged that Aramark's obligation to supervise inmates consists of supervising their performance of their food service and basic security duties and issues. Employees, agents, officers, servants, contractors and inmates of CCNO are not agents or employees of Aramark and as such, no liability shall be incurred by Aramark by reason of the acts or omissions of such persons except as provided herein. CCNO shall promptly notify Aramark of any claim for which indemnity is sought, and shall cooperate with the other party in the defense of such claim. The indemnifying party shall have the sole discretion to defend and settle such claim.

- (J) **DAMAGES:** In no event will either party be liable to the other party for any loss of business, business interruption, consequential, special, indirect or punitive damages.
- (K) **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS; PROMULGATION OF POLICIES:** Each party hereto shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, regulations and requirements applicable to their activities hereunder. CCNO will provide reasonable and adequate physical security at all times for Aramark employees, suppliers, management and other authorized visitors. In addition, Aramark shall, within 60 days of the commencement of this Agreement, promulgate policies and procedures in compliance with the Standards for Jails in Ohio (Full Service Facilities) for food service operations. These policies and procedures shall be for service operations. The Executive Director of the CCNO shall approve the policies and procedures and any subsequent revisions thereto prior to implementation.
- (L) **RETURN OF EQUIPMENT:** Aramark shall return to CCNO at the expiration of this Agreement the food service premises and all equipment furnished by CCNO in the condition in which received, except for ordinary wear and tear and except to the extent that said premises and equipment may have been lost or damaged by fire, flood, or other disaster not caused by Aramark, and except to the extent that said equipment may have been stolen by persons other than employees of Aramark without negligence on the part of Aramark or its employees.
- (M) **LICENSE, FEES, PERMITS, AND TAXES:** Aramark shall secure and pay all federal, state and local licenses, permits, and fees which may pertain to this contract or may be required for the operation of the food services provided for hereunder. In the event a sales or similar tax is assessed Aramark under the terms of this Agreement, CCNO shall reimburse Aramark for such tax.
- (N) **FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT:** CCNO agrees at its expense to provide Aramark with adequate preparation kitchen facilities at the Corrections Center



completely equipped and ready to operate, together with such heat, refrigeration and utilities services as may be reasonably required for the efficient performance of the Agreement. Aramark shall be responsible for long distance telephone service.

CCNO shall furnish building maintenance services for the premises and shall provide preventive maintenance and equipment repairs and replacements for CCNO owned equipment in accordance with such standards as are customary for corrections facilities such as the Corrections Center. Vandalism or misuse of equipment and/or the disabling of the equipment by Aramark or an Aramark employee shall be the responsibility of Aramark to repair. CCNO shall provide office facilities for Aramark. CCNO will furnish and maintain the initial adequate inventory of service ware, thermal tray and support equipment, pots, pans, beverage containers and utensils at the facility.

- (O) Aramark shall submit a contingency emergency plan to provide for meal service if any event occurs that would preclude normal operation, including but not limited to, power failure, fire, riot, lockdown, or acts of God that would cripple normal operations. CCNO shall use its best efforts to assist Aramark by permitting reasonable variations in the menu cycle, Product offerings, and for method of service, as conditions may require. However, Aramark will not be relieved of its responsibility to provide meal service under the terms of this Agreement. Additional costs, if any, incurred providing service during an emergency shall be borne by CCNO.

### 3. FINANCIAL AGREEMENT:

- (A) CCNO shall notify Aramark of the actual number of meals to be ordered each day at a mutually agreed upon time with additions or deletions within an agreed time prior to meal service. When such notice is not given timely, Aramark shall prepare the same number of meals as prepared the previous day. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Aramark shall develop a program to provide meals to CCNO employees, officials and visitors at a mutually agreed upon price.

Aramark shall submit to the CCNO on the first day of every week, for the preceding week, an invoice for all number of meals ordered or served, whichever is greater, and other goods and services provided by Aramark, if any. All meals are to be charged using a single price per meal and not a separate price for breakfast, lunch and supper. The price per meal charged to CCNO for the Corrections Center and the Juvenile Detention Center shall be as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. These prices shall be effective from November 4, 2018 through December 31, 2019. Aramark will provide, at no additional cost, a lacto-ovo vegetarian and/or vegan diet for all religious requests from the administrative or religious authority. Other religious meals requested by the administrative or religious authority, such as prepackaged meals, shall be provided at a price to be mutually agreed in advance. The invoice submitted will show a

breakdown of the meals served (i.e. unit, work release). After the initial period, the price per meal shall be adjusted annually on January 1.

The per meal prices stated in this Agreement are firm for the period beginning on November 5, 2018 and ending on December 31, 2019. Per meal prices for each subsequent 12-month period shall be increased in January each year by an amount to be mutually agreed upon by the parties and set forth in an amendment to this Agreement; provided, however, that in the event no agreement is reached with respect to such increase, per meal prices shall be increased by the yearly percentage change in the Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, Food Away From Home Index ("CPI-FAH"), published by the U.S. Department of Labor. The period for determining CPI-FAH increases shall be September of the immediately preceding year to September of the then-current year.

CCNO will remit payment no later than ten (10) days after receipt of invoice to the address listed on the invoice.

- (B) FOOD SERVICES required by CCNO outside the scope of this Agreement will be provided by Aramark upon written authorization by CCNO and mutually agreed upon prices for such services.
- (C) COMMISSARY: Aramark shall provide a large selection of food, candy and gum, non-alcoholic beverages, health and drug items, and general merchandise, including quality brand name products (collectively, the "Products"), all of which shall be subject to the approval of CCNO. Aramark shall assign a full-time manager to operate the commissary. (This employee is in addition to those assigned to the kitchen.) The salary and benefits for this employee shall be paid from revenues generated from commissary sales. Other expenses charged to the commissary shall include office supplies, forms, and paper bags. Aramark shall be responsible for purchasing, storing and maintaining an inventory of all commissary items. Items may be added or deleted from this list by CCNO. CCNO shall be responsible to collect, record and make disbursements from inmate commissary accounts for purchases of such Products; provided, however, that Aramark shall have access to each inmate account solely for the purpose of verifying that there are sufficient funds in such account to cover a Product order placed by such inmate, including but not limited to, any sales, use or other taxes related thereto.

Aramark shall submit to CCNO on the first day of every week, for the preceding week, an invoice for total Gross Sales of Products made during such week, and other goods or services provided by Aramark during such week, if any. The term "Gross Sales" shall mean total commissary sales (including, but not limited to, sales of tobacco products, stamps and pre-stamped envelopes, pre-paid telephone calling cards or any other telephone sales, debit cards, and indigent Product sales) plus any sales or use taxes. For purposes of this Agreement, a sale shall be deemed made when a Product ordered by an inmate is delivered to CCNO for subsequent delivery to the inmate, and the Product is not returned. For purposes of this Agreement, all

sales are final and no returns will be honored unless the inmate who ordered a Product refuses delivery of such Product at the time such Product is delivered. If an inmate is released prior to Product delivery and fails to claim such Product within seventy-two (72) hours after release, the Product shall become the responsibility of Aramark.

Aramark and CCNO will mutually determine the prices at which Products are sold. If Aramark sustains increases in its costs, including but not limited to, increases in its product, labor or equipment or software-related costs, Aramark may increase its prices to recover such increased costs. Pricing of all items shall be competitive to those charged at local convenience stores. ("Comparable Retail Values"). In the event that any of Aramark's prices are below the Comparable Retail Values, the parties shall agree to increase such prices under this Agreement to reflect the Comparable Retail Values. Aramark shall retain all receipts from the commissary operation, from which Aramark shall be entitled to reimburse itself for its expenses, which shall include all Direct Costs (defined as all costs incurred by Aramark directly attributable to the commissary services provided by Aramark hereunder, including, but not limited to, labor and related payroll costs, license and permit fees, taxes, products, forms, paper bags and supplies) and Charges (defined as an amount established by Aramark, which is reasonably allocated to CCNO, for certain services provided by Aramark to client locations. Such Charges shall include, but are not limited to, a Charge for providing insurance and related services, a Charge for fringe benefits and human resource services, and a Charge for information technology). Funds derived from the sale of commissary items must be collected, deposited and dispersed in a manner consistent with the State of Ohio Auditor's Office rules and regulations and statutory requirements. Discounts not exclusively related to Aramark's commissary operation at CCNO shall not be credited to CCNO's account. Costs related to bringing in labor/personnel not assigned to CCNO will not be reimbursed. In the event commissary receipts (which shall include receipts from the iCARE program, as defined below) for any month exceed Aramark's expenses for the month, CCNO and Aramark shall share such excess as follows: 50% to CCNO and 50% to Aramark. Aramark shall submit a detailed statement of operations of the commissary to CCNO on a monthly basis along with CCNO's share of excess receipts. CCNO retains the right to conduct periodic audits of Aramark's records relating to the commissary.

- (D) iCARE: Aramark shall implement its iCARE program at the Corrections Center. Aramark shall determine the prices at which iCARE items shall be sold. If Aramark sustains increases in its costs, including but not limited to, increases in its product, labor or equipment costs, Aramark and CCNO may agree to increase the iCARE prices to recover such increased costs. No returns shall be accepted unless the inmate, who ordered a product, is released prior to such delivery. All sales shall be deemed made when an iCARE item purchased is delivered to the inmate. Aramark shall have the ability to communicate with inmates, and inmates' families and friends regarding the iCARE program if such communication is approved by CCNO prior to distribution.

- (E) **FRESH FAVORITES:** Upon mutual agreement, Aramark may implement its Fresh Favorites program at the Facility. If Aramark sustains increases in its costs, including but not limited to, increases in its product, labor or equipment costs, Aramark may increase its Fresh Favorites prices to recover such increased costs. No returns shall be accepted unless the inmate, who ordered a product, is released prior to such delivery. All sales shall be deemed made when a Fresh Favorite item purchased by an inmate is delivered

Aramark shall pay to CCNO a commission in an amount equal to Ten Percent (10%) of Net Sales on the Fresh Favorite items. Within fifteen (15) days after the end of each month, Aramark shall deliver to CCNO a check covering commissions on Net Sales made during the prior month. For purposes of this Paragraph "Net Sales" means total Fresh Favorite products sales, less sales or use taxes, authorized returns and handling charges.

- (F) **NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM:** In the event of changes in the regulations governing Child Nutrition Programs, Aramark and CCNO shall mutually agree upon any modifications to the menu and the per meal rates necessary as a result of such changes. Furthermore, CCNO represents and warrants that it has obtained all necessary approvals from any relevant state agency with respect to the provision of juvenile meals and reimbursement under the National School Lunch Program.
- (G) **IN2WORK:** Aramark shall provide vocational training and classroom instruction regarding proper food production skills to qualified inmates at the Facility through its IN2WORK program ("I2W"). Training will include deployment of Aramark's proprietary materials. CCNO will approve any and all curriculum pertaining to the IN2WORK program prior to program implementation. CCNO will be provided with a bi-weekly list of participants and their status in the program. CCNO acknowledges that Aramark's willingness to implement the I2W program under this Agreement does not give CCNO any right, title, or license in the program.

4. **ACCESS AND RECORDS:** Aramark agrees to retain all books, records and other documents at the address set forth in the preamble, relevant to determining Aramark's performance under this Agreement for thirty-six (36) months after the close of the CCNO fiscal year (January 1 through December 31).
5. **TERM OF AGREEMENT:** This Agreement shall be in full force and effect as of November 5, 2018 ("Commencement Date") and shall continue in full force and effect through December 31, 2019. By mutual agreement, this Agreement may be extended by the parties for an additional four (4) twelve (12) month period(s). In no event shall the length of this agreement, including renewal periods, exceed sixty (60) months.

6. **EVENTS OF DEFAULT:** The occurrence of any of the following shall be an event of default ("Event of Default"):

- (A) Aramark fails to perform or observe any term or condition of this Agreement;
- (B) Aramark files a voluntary petition in bankruptcy or commences a bankruptcy or similar proceeding;
- (C) Aramark fails, within 28 days, to dismiss any involuntary bankruptcy petition or other commencement of a bankruptcy or similar proceeding against Aramark or to lift a stay of any execution, garnishment or attachment of such consequence as will impair Aramark's ability to perform this Agreement;
- (D) Aramark is granted a petition in bankruptcy, makes an assignment for the benefit of its creditors or enters into an agreement of composition with its creditors;
- (E) A court of competent jurisdiction approves a petition for the reorganization of Aramark instituted under the provisions of any state or federal bankruptcy, insolvency or similar law;
- (F) A court of competent jurisdiction appoints a receiver of the whole or any substantial part of the properties of Aramark;
- (G) Any representation or warranty made by Aramark in this Agreement or in any report, certificate, application, financial statement or other instrument shall prove to be materially false, misleading or incorrect as of the date made;
- (H) Aramark is dissolved, liquidated or ceases to do business;
- (I) Aramark vacates or abandons the Facilities or any part thereof or ceases to do business for any reason whatsoever;
- (J) Any lien is filed against Aramark, or a Facility or funds held by the CCNO by any creditor of Aramark.

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon a breach or default of this Agreement by the other party, which is not cured within thirty (30) days after receipt by the defaulting party of a notice from the non-defaulting party, specifying the nature of such breach or default. Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, which is not cured within thirty (30) days after receipt by Aramark of a notice from CCNO, specifying the nature of such breach or default, CCNO may do one or more of the following:

- (A) Terminate this Agreement;

- (B) Take possession of the food service area and all materials, equipment, tools, supplies, inventory, equipment and machinery therein owned by Aramark;
- (C) Provide food services by whatever methods the CCNO may deem appropriate;
- (D) Withhold any further payment to Aramark;
- (E) Pursue any other rights or remedies available in law or at equity.

7. TERMINATION:

- (A) Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause at the end of any calendar month of operation by giving not less than 90 days prior written notice to be sent via U.S. certified mail. Upon such termination, CCNO or the successor to Aramark may purchase any remaining usable inventory at Aramark's invoice cost. If this Agreement is terminated under any circumstances, CCNO shall pay Aramark for all inmate and staff meals, commissary and other services, provided by Aramark to and including the date of termination, at the rates and within the payment periods set forth in this Agreement. CCNO's obligation to pay for meals and commissary services provided shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- (B) Upon termination of this Agreement, the following shall occur:
  - (i) Aramark shall turn over and account for all equipment and other property belonging to CCNO;
  - (ii) Aramark shall make available to CCNO all data, records and reports concerning food service at the Facility; and
  - (iii) Aramark and CCNO shall promptly settle all accounts as of the date of termination.

8. NOTICE: All notices or other communication hereunder shall be deemed to be duly given when made in writing and delivered by a nationally recognized overnight courier or deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested and addressed to the party at its respective address first set forth above, or such other address as it may designate, by notice given as aforesaid.

9. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST: Aramark covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with performance of this Agreement and no person having any such interest shall be employed by Aramark. In addition, no officer, agent or employee of the CCNO and no member of its governing body shall participate in any decision relating to this Agreement which affects his/her personal interest or any corporation, partnership, association which he/she is directly or indirectly interested or has any personal or pecuniary interest.

10. **PRESS RELATIONS & PUBLICITY RIGHTS:** Aramark shall coordinate with CCNO on any and all press or media releases. Neither Aramark nor CCNO shall disclose the terms of this Agreement to any other person or entity outside its organization other than as required by law. Neither CCNO nor Aramark and its Affiliates shall, without the other Party's consent, use the other Party's name, logo, trademark or otherwise refer to or identify the other Party in any publicity matters relating to the Services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, both Parties and their respective Affiliates may, without prior consent of the other Party, use that Party's name or logo and the existence of this Agreement in connection with earnings calls or similar matters with their respective investors or analysts as well as communications to prospective clients (if applicable) and for use in such Party's marketing materials.
11. **CONFIDENTIALITY:** All financial, statistical and operating statements and personnel data, including but not limited to, software, technical manuals, recipes, menus and meal plans, and policy and procedure manuals relative to or utilized in Aramark's business or the business of Aramark and its subsidiaries, shall be the sole property of Aramark and shall be confidential and constitute trade secrets of Aramark. CCNO shall use its best efforts to keep such information confidential and to so instruct its agents, employees and independent contractors. CCNO shall not photocopy or otherwise duplicate any materials containing any Aramark proprietary or confidential information without the prior written consent of Aramark. The use of such data by CCNO in any manner including, but not limited to, the use in any computer program, shall not destroy Aramark's ownership or its confidentiality. It is expressly understood and agreed between CCNO and Aramark that those parts of any computer programs or other proprietary information by Aramark which are based upon Aramark's data, shall also be confidential and the property of Aramark, unless the parties hereto mutually agree to the contrary in writing. Aramark shall submit to CCNO necessary data as requested by CCNO for its reporting requirements, which data may be reasonably utilized by CCNO in satisfaction of such reporting requirements, but reserves the right to designate certain material as proprietary and not for publication. Upon expiration or any termination of this Agreement, all use of Aramark's proprietary or confidential information shall cease and all materials containing any Aramark proprietary information shall be returned to Aramark.
12. **ASSIGNABILITY:** Aramark may not assign this Agreement without CCNO's prior written consent (not to be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed), unless such assignment or transfer of the Agreement is to an affiliate of Aramark in which case no consent is required. The term "affiliate" means any corporation or limited liability company controlling, controlled by or under common control with, Aramark.
13. **EXTENT OF AGREEMENT:** This Agreement, together with the RFP and Proposal represents the entire contract between CCNO and Aramark and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both CCNO and Aramark.
14. **RENEGOTIATION:** The financial arrangements in this Agreement are based on conditions existing on the date Aramark commences operations including any



representations regarding existing and future conditions made by CCNO in connection with the negotiation and execution of this Agreement. If such conditions change due to causes beyond Aramark's control, including, but not limited to, a change in the scope of Aramark's services, menu changes, the Facility's inmate population, the availability of inmate labor, efforts to organize labor, increases in product, food, fuel, equipment, utilities, labor and supply costs, Federal, State and local sales, and other taxes and other operation costs, a change in Federal, State and local standards, requirement recommendations, and regulations including any applicable Child Nutrition Programs, changes in phone service providers or a change in the way phone service is sold to Aramark, and the manner in which the Index (hereinafter defined) is calculated, or other unforeseen external market conditions outside of Aramark's control then Aramark shall give CCNO written notice of such increase or change, and within thirty (30) calendar days after such notice, Aramark and CCNO shall mutually agree upon modification(s) to offset the impact of the increase or change, which modifications may include any or a combination of the following: an adjustment to Aramark's price per meal or commission, modifications to the menu or Product offerings, changes to Product pricing or modifications to Aramark's scope of services..

15. GOVERNING LAW: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio. Any future disputes over this Agreement will be heard in a court of competent jurisdiction in Williams County, Ohio.
16. BINDING EFFECT: This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, legal representatives and permitted assigns of CCNO and Aramark.
17. CUMULATIVE REMEDIES: The duties and obligations imposed by the Agreement and the rights and remedies available hereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation on any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise available at law or in equity.
18. WAIVER: No waiver by the CCNO of any condition or covenant herein contained or any breach of any such condition or covenant shall be held or taken to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of such covenant or condition, or to permit or excuse its continuance or any future breach of any such condition or covenant.
19. COUNTERPARTS: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original hereof, but all of which together shall constitute but one in the same document.

**Amendment to Management Operating Agreement**

This price shall be effective from May 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 and shall supersede in all respects the price per meal set forth in Exhibit A of the Agreement or in any other prior agreements between the parties.

2. **Menu Change:** The parties agree an additional menu shall be available at the Corrections Center as set forth in Attachment B effective as of the Effective Date.

3. Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain unaffected by this Amendment and continue in full force and effect.

**WHEREAS**, CCNO and Aramark entered into a Management Operating Agreement dated November 5, 2018 for the management of the food service operation at the Corrections Center of Northwest Ohio (the "Corrections Center") and the Juvenile Center and the commissary operation at the Corrections Center (the "Agreement");

**WHEREAS**, the parties acknowledge the need to address volatility in the cost of food commodities; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties desire to amend the provisions of the Agreement as follows, effective January 1, 2021.



This amount shall be effective from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.
4. **Effect of Amendment:** Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain unaffected by this Amendment and shall continue in full force and effect.



These prices shall be effective from January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022, and shall supersede in all respects the price per meal set forth in Exhibit A of the Agreement or in any other prior agreements between the parties.
3. **Personnel Reimbursement:** In accordance with Paragraph 3(C) of the Agreement, the portion of the salary and benefits for commissary labor that is paid from revenues generated from commissary sales shall be changed to an amount equal to 270.37 each week. This amount shall be effective from January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022.
4. **Effect of Amendment:** Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain unaffected by this Amendment and shall continue in full force and effect.

**Amendment No. 4 to Management Operating Agreement**

**THIS AMENDMENT NO. 4** (the "Amendment"), is entered into this 16th day of August, 2022 by and between the **Corrections Commission of Northwest Ohio**, a multi-county municipal correctional facility having its place of business at 03151 CCNO Road 2425, Stryker, Ohio 43557-9418 ("CCNO"), and **Aramark Correctional Services, LLC**, a Delaware limited liability company, having its principal place of business located at 2400 Market Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19103 ("Aramark").

**WHEREAS**, CCNO and Aramark entered into a Management Operating Agreement dated November 5, 2018 for the management of the food service operation at the Corrections Center of Northwest Ohio (the "Corrections Center") and the Juvenile Center and the commissary operation at the Corrections Center (the "Agreement");

**WHEREAS**, the parties acknowledge the need to address volatility in the cost of food commodities; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties desire to amend the provisions of the Agreement as follows, effective August 1, 2022 (the "Effective Date").

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises in the Agreement and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as set forth below. Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Amendment have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the Agreement.

1. **Price Adjustment:** Notwithstanding Paragraph 3(A) of the Agreement, the parties agree that the price per meal charged to CCNO by Aramark shall be changed as set forth on Attachment A as a result of mutual agreement of the parties. These prices shall be effective from August 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 and shall supersede in all respects the price per meal set forth in Exhibit A of the Agreement or in any other prior agreements between the parties. The parties further agree that future price adjustments relating to January 1, 2023 and thereafter will be adjusted pursuant to Section 3(A) of the Agreement.

2. **Effect of Amendment:** Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain unaffected by this Amendment and shall continue in full force and effect.
